Preparing for Your Demonstration!

- Select Your Topic!
 - Must relate to a 4-H Project area (see back for project list)
 - Choose a topic you know something about, or enjoy taking about.

Decide how will teach your topic.

- Use step by step instructions
- Be specific and explain what you are doing.

Select materials.

- Use supplies and props to demonstrate with.
- Follow school rules (nothing that can be dangerous or against school policy)
- No live animals!
- Be creative!

Design your posters.

- Stay away from trifold boards
- Use a poster, or set of posters.
- List your steps and supplies on your poster(s)
- Include a Title!

• Format and practice your presentation.

- Introduction
- "show and tell" all of your materials
- Step by Step Instructions
- Conclusion
