#### **RULES**

- 1. Poster MUST be about 4-H or relate to 4-H in some way.
- 2. Must be a 14 by 22 inch poster board.
- 3. Must be HORIZONTAL (not vertical)
- 4. Objects glued to board must be as FLAT as possible and should not extend more than 1/8 of an inch from the poster.
- 5. Poster should be neat. Do not use glitter or similar items that easily rub or fall off.
- 6. Do NOT use copyrighted or well known characters (Such as Garfield, Spiderman or Cinderella).
- 7. Please write your name, school, teacher and grade on the back of the poster.

This what we are looking for when we judge posters. The best 1-2 posters in each class will receive a blue ribbon. Winning posters will be brought by the 4-H member to the County Fine Arts Contest on **Monday**, **November 3**<sup>rd</sup>, **2025**!

Please note: Posters not the correct size will be disqualified.

Item	Description	Points
Size	Is the poster the correct size? Poster MUST be on a 14 by 22 inch poster board.	30
Use of 4-H	Does the poster relate to 4-H? Does it include the word 4-H or a clover?	30
Creativity	Is the poster creative?	20
Neatness	Is the poster neat and easy to read?	10
Messaging	Does the poster convey a message? Does it inspire others to join 4-H?	10

#### **USING THE 4-H CLOVER**

Using the 4-H clover on your poster is a great idea, but you have to use it correctly!

Using the rules below, find the correct clover and circle it!

- 1. The emblem must be used in its entirety meaning you must use the whole image.
- 2. The stem on the clover always points to the RIGHT.
- 3. Do not place text or images on top of the clover.
- 4. The clover must use all four H's.
- 5. The clover must be turned upright -not sideways, crooked or upside down.
- 6. The emblem must be a solid green, black or white.













## Digital Poster Contest

- 1. Must be submitted in a PDF or PNG format.
- 2. Entries should be clear (not be blurry, grainy, or pixeled).
  - (In most cases, 640 x 480 pixels should provide a clear image.)
  - Tip: If using a computer program such as Microsoft Publisher, when you save your image as a PNG in the dialogue box, there is a "resolution" box and you can change it from "standard printing" to "high quality or commercial."
- 3. Examples of programs that could be used for designing your digital poster include, but are not limited to:
  - a.Microsoft PowerPoint
  - b. Microsoft Publisher
  - c. Adobe Illustrator
  - d. Adobe InDesign
  - e.Canva
- 4. Digital posters should be in the landscape (or horizontal) format.
- 5. Digital posters are not photographs of a regular poster but rather computer graphics/design created on the computer.
