ORGANIZING YOUR SPEECH

INTRODUCTION

2-3 sentences that states the main purpose of your speech and introduces us to you and your topic.

BODY

Organize your information into main points about your topic. Each point should be it's own paragraph and have supporting information explaining that point.

CONCLUSION

2-3 sentences that summarize and restate the main points and highlights of your speech.
What was the main "take away" you want us to remember?

Here is what we are looking for when we listen to your speech. Make sure to include all of the items below for your best chance to participate at the county contest. To be considered for county, you must score a minimum of 70 points. The best 2-3 speeches in each class that score at least a 70 will receive a blue ribbon and be invited to the county contest!

Organization		
Introduction	Is there a well developed introduction that explains the purpose or main point of the speech?	15
Body	Is the speech broken up into main points or sections that are easy to follow and understand?	10
Conclusion	Is there a well developed conclusion that summarizes or wraps up the main point of the speech: A restatement of the main points or take-aways?	15
Speaker		
Voice	Does the speaker speak loudly and clearly enough for the audience to hear them?	15
Eye Contact	Does the speaker look at the audience or only read from their cards or notes?	15
Posture	Does the speaker stand up straight, or lean on tables or walls? Does the speaker fidget?	10
Well Prepared	Does the speaker seem to be prepared, is it obvious they practiced and came ready to give their speech?	10
Time Limit	Was the speech the appropriate time for their grade level? Or was is too short/too long?	10
